Welcome to the first edition of the New Year. We are thrilled to see what we have in store for the New Year in the preschool room. We will continue to practice working on our sight words; spelling our names; recognizing the letters of the alphabets; counting with the goal of counting to 50 by the end of March; learning all of our shapes; and learning how to take our time when coloring and learning to color inside the lines.

We notice that some children are still having a hard time learning to hold the pencil the correct way but as a team we can work on this together. They will be introduced into learning how to cut with age appropriate scissors. We are asking that we, as a TEAM, continue to work with children so they can be the best they can be.

Ways you can help? Ask them what they learned today. Help them with their homework if they need help.

Beginning next month we will start introducing math into our learning activities. You can also help with them leaning how to hold their pencils the right way and recognize the letters in the alphabets. If you have any questions please feel free to ask the teachers. Everyone should have a handbook where you can find the daycare's policy. If you don't, please email me and I will send you one. I will take this opportunity to remind you of some policies that we feel there is a need to reinforce.

- Arrival Time: Children are to arrive between the hours of 7:00am and 9:00am. We DO NOT accept children after 9:00am. You have a time frame of 2 hours to drop of your child at daycare. Please take advantage of those 2 hours. We have notice an increased number of parents calling to say that they are running behind. That is no longer accepted because there is a 2 hour time frame scheduled for that. Please plan ahead!
- **Breakfast** is served at 8:00am. Please have your child at the center by 8:15 if you want us to serve him /her breakfast. If your child arrives at 8:16 they will not be served. Your child will have to eat before entering the facility. You do not want your child to start the day without eating anything. Please plan accordingly!
- School supplies: Please make sure that you child has all items needed: book bag, lunch box, change of clothes (2 tops, 2 bottoms, 2 underwear, 2 pair of socks, 2 undershirts), bottles, diapers, wipes, food, etc. Also make sure that ALL items are labeled. We keep reminding about labeling the items and parents are still bringing them without. At the beginning of the school year we had requested a small clear plastic bin that can hold your child's extra clothes. If you have not done so, please bring one.
- **Thermometer:** All parents need to have a thermometer in hand to read their child's temperature upon arriving to the Center. We are asking parents to purchase a DIGITAL thermometer to do the reading. It's quick and easy and won't take too long of your time. The drop off process should be a quick one. Therefore the temperature taking should not take a long time.
- Face Masks: All children in our care that are two years old and up are required to wear a proper face mask. Please include extra face masks in your child's bag in case they are wet or they are worn/damage. Face masks need to fully cover the nose and mouth area. We have noticed children wearing the same clothe face mask for several days. This is not sanitary. Masks need to be change frequently. I am asking parents to have their children wear KN95 masks instead of the clothe ones. Those give them more protection. Yes, they are a little costly. But isn't your child's health worth it?
- **Homework:** The teachers send home work for the children to do. This is an opportunity for parents to interact with the child and see what they are learning academically. Please bring back the homework the next day along with the folder that is sent home in.
- **Birthday Celebration:** If your child is having a birthday and you would like to celebrate it while they are in our care, please send me an email so I can be informed. There are some guidelines that we need you to follow in regards to things to bring, time, etc.
- Communication: Any communication that needs to be done with your child's teacher needs to be done calling the daycare's phone line. DO NOT text or call the teachers cell phone to discuss anything that pertains to your child while he is under our care. Some teachers have exchanged phone numbers with parents and it is in violation of our policy. In order for the Administration to be able to get involved if a situation arises with any exchange of communication with parent/teacher, we need this policy to be strongly followed.
